




Increased access to and use of internet in the region

- Growing internet use over the last decade (CAGR ~ 14%)
- On average, the region is on par with worldwide internet use



• Citizens widely use different digital platforms to communicate, interact, engage in commerce




Individuals using digital platforms, 2024 (%)

Some lessons learned and recommendations

Rationale for reforms

- What is the current state and goals of digital transformation in the market?
- Are there gaps in the current legislative framework?
- What are the benefits and costs of adopting or updating enabling legal frameworks for digital transformation?

Drafting frameworks and building consensus

- Identify and engage with key lead agencies early on
- Ensure broad consultation with stakeholders, including public agencies, private sector, and international partners
- Draft fit-for-purpose legal frameworks consistent with local needs/capabilities and good practices

• Anticipating implementation challenges

- Explore whether existing agencies have capabilities to implement reforms
- Estimate resourcing requirements
- Provide enough lead time to effectively build-up capabilities to implement reforms
- Explore regional coordination opportunities
- Engage government agencies and international partners to secure resourcing support
